



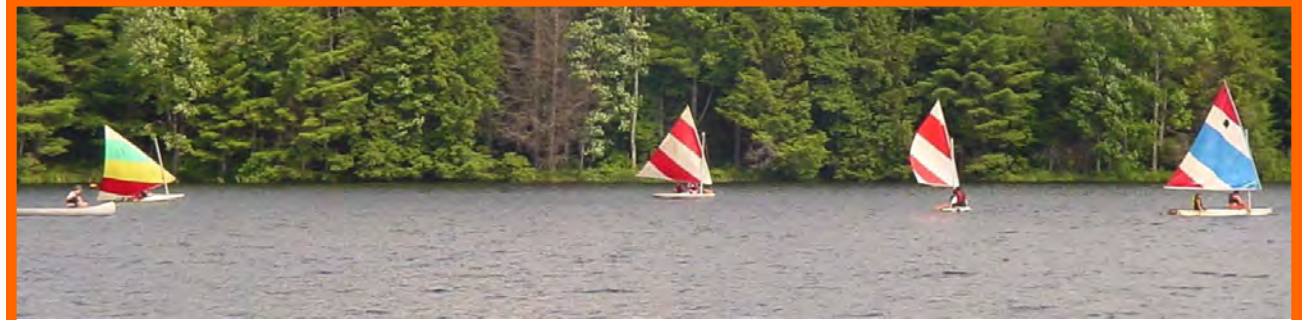

MERIT BADGE MADNESS

Scouts can earn a variety of merit badges at Forestburg. Both traditional summer camp badges such as Archery and unexpected badges such as Space Exploration are on the menu. Scouts learn best in small groups focused on a specific topic.

Merit Badges are offered in four different periods each day. This leaves a good part of each afternoon for Scouts to enjoy open activities such as archery, rifle, shotgun, swimming, canoeing, kayaking, sailing, rowing, paddle boarding, hiking, climbing, and rappelling.

Forestburg offers over 40 different merit badges in seven different areas. These areas include Aquatics, Ecology/Conservation (ECON), Handicraft, High Adventure, Scoutcraft, Shooting Sports, and Technology.

AQUATICS: Canoeing, Lifesaving, Kayaking, Rowing, Small Boat Sailing, and Swimming.

ECON: Astronomy, Environmental Science, Fish and Wildlife Management, Fishing, Mammal Study, Nature, Oceanography, and Weather.

HANDICRAFT: Animation, Art, Basketry, Chess, Fingerprinting, Leatherwork, Photography, and Woodcarving.

HIGH ADVENTURE: Climbing and Cycling.

SCOUTCRAFT: Camping, Emergency Preparedness, First Aid, Orienteering, Pioneering, Signs-Signals and Codes, and Wilderness Survival.

SHOOTING SPORTS: Archery, Rifle Shooting, and Shotgun Shooting.

TECHNOLOGY: Communications, Chemistry, Digital Technology, Electricity, Electronics, Engineering, Graphic Arts, Nuclear Science, Programming, Radio, and Space Exploration.



Frontier Camp

Our Frontier Camp Program is offered for Scouts that want the flexibility to schedule their own program choices, but still focus on learning the requirements necessary for a specific rank.

Frontier Camp is an opportunity for Scouts to learn the requirements for a specific rank in one program period during the day. This allows the Scout to maximize their ability to earn merit badges and still focus on advancement to the next rank. While in Frontier Camp, Scouts will have the opportunity to learn many of the requirements needed for the ranks they choose to sign up for. Scoutmasters will receive a progress report on each Scout at the end of the week. It is up to the Scoutmaster to review the Scout's completion of requirements before signing them off.



Buckskin Campers

Our Buckskin Camper program is a full day program intended specifically for first year Scouts. This program will place Scouts in a Patrol for the week and allow them to get hands on training in a wide variety of Scouting skills while learning rank requirements for all ranks. The Buckskin Camper program is an opportunity for Scouts to try their hand at knot tying, some basic outdoor skills, learn a little first aid, learn to lash, and even take a nature hike. The big thing here is to have fun while trying.

While in the Buckskin Camper program, Scouts will have the opportunity to learn many of the requirements needed for the ranks of Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class. Scouts will also sign up for merit badge classes in Period A and C in the mornings. Scoutmasters will receive a progress report on each Scout at the end of the week. It is up to the Scoutmaster to review the Scout's completion of requirements before signing them off.



Outback Program

Our Outback Program has been created for Scouts who take the trail less traveled. Exciting event-packed days of the best high adventure challenges the Catskill mountains, lakes and rivers offer. Delaware River canoe trek, horseback riding, rock climbing and rappelling, water skiing and water tubing and an overnight mountain biking trek make this program popular with our senior Scouts. Specifically for Scouts 14 and older with a minimum of the rank of First Class. No experience is necessary. Great as a Senior Patrol Activity! This is also a great program for Venture Crews and Explorer Posts.

This program is offered during each week of the FSR Summer Camp program. Each week this program is limited to the first 16 Scouts to sign up for this program. The total cost for this program is \$455.00. There are no discounts available for the outback program. Participants will camp with their home or provisional Troop during their participation in this program.
